





PRE-WAR RUN – AUSTIN 7 RUN SA MAY 6-8, 2023 A \$50 deposit is required, per booking, paid to A7 bank account or phone The Treasurer to pay by CARD.

Preliminary plans are underway to have a weekend Austin 7 run up to the Adelaide hills on May 6th - 8th 2023.

The Itinerary could end up something like the following.

- Meet at Hazelwood Park and travel up Greenhill Rd ready for a 9.00am departure travelling up Greenhill Road then turning right onto Mount Lofty Summit road proceeding to Mawson Drive on your left and make your way to Mount Lofty Botanical Garden where we will have a walk through part of the garden.
- On departing the garden, I suggest we follow the leader and return back to Crafers perhaps driving around the historic Mount Lofty House car park on the way. Once back at the Crafers roundabout take the first exit on the left and proceed to the SE freeway briefly before taking the Stirling exit and slowly making our way to Aldgate where we have a number of options for lunch including Fred's Eatery, Dirty Doris's or possibly the Aldgate Pump Hotel.
- After lunch we will make our way to Hahndorf and check in to our accommodation for the next two nights (The Old Mill). After this participants are encouraged to explore Hahndorf until pre dinner drinks prior to an evening meal at a venue yet to be determined.
- Sunday morning breakfast will be of your choosing with a number of establishments offering traditional German style breakfasts. Following breakfast, a 9.30am departure will see us heading for Woodside with a visit to the Chocolate factory before heading up to Lobethal for lunch (possibly at Lobethal Bierhaus). After lunch we will take a different route back to Hahndorf where we will have our evening meal.
- Monday will see us depart Hahndorf and head for home.



With under a year to go we would like to give fellow "Austineers" an update as to the progress on AOA2024

Orange is a significant regional centre with a population of over 40,000 and is renowned for its gourmet wineries, award winning restaurants, and magnificent gardens. The trees will be revealing their vibrant autumn colours when we are there. Day temperatures average a pleasant 24^o with cool 11^o evenings.

To date we have over 100 Expressions of interest and support from the locals has been extremely positive.

There are many types of accommodation options in Orange and we suggest you book early with your chosen provider to avoid disappointment. Budget accommodation is extremely sought after.

Event headquarters will be The Orange Function Centre but, to avoid traffic congestion, not all outings will start there. Final run details along with registration forms and meal arrangements will follow in a later newsletter. Daily runs will be on sealed roads excluding potholes and roadworks which are out of our control and avoiding highways where possible. Lunches will be available on Friday and Saturday.

We propose registration will be at The Orange Function Centre on Thursday afternoon with a full meet and greet meal later that evening at the same venue.

On Friday 8th. We're off to Millthorpe via historic Carcoar. (100k return)

Saturday 9th. We will meet at Lake Canobolas then out to Molong. (75k return)

Sunday 10^{th.} Display day in central Orange.

Followed by an official dinner and presentations at Orange Ex Services Club.

Monday 11^{th.} On our last day we will visit Abercrombie House in Bathurst. (56k one-way) This 1870's home is an Australian treasure and the owners, the Morgan family, have had an association with Austin Sheerlines for many years. Several cars are displayed on the property. A tour of the house and a substantial morning tea will be offered.

AOA2024 will officially conclude at Abercrombie House. Entrants can choose to explore Bathurst, head home, or return to Orange for another night with friends.

Old Adelaide

Adelaide to Alice Springs 1955



In 1955, two years after Dinah Shore urged Americans to hit the highway and see the USA in their Chevrolet, my parents drove their 1937 Dodge Coupe to Alice Springs from my hometown of Adelaide, on Australia's southern coast.

The old Dodge was all my parents could afford. Dad, a mechanic, had carefully stripped and rebuilt the car in preparation for what he knew would be a rugged trip, having done it two years earlier in an open-top 1927 Chevy while heading to Darwin in Australia's tropical far north to hunt crocodiles.

Modifications included fitting half-inch wider tires, lug pattern treads on the rear, bolting a spotlight to the roof, and replacing the rumble seat with a 19-gallon fuel tank to bring the total fuel capacity to almost 34 gallons—vital for a journey where the longest stretch between gas stations would be 425 miles. Back then the tarmac ended 200 miles out of Adelaide, and rare rains had left the dirt road sodden and soggy. As Mum recorded in her journal, they made it a further 113 miles in seven-and-a-half hours of hard driving, at times ploughing through 250-yard stretches with water over the running boards, before the Dodge slithered to a halt in a gooey mass of red clay. "For two solid hours we dug, jacked, and heaved stones under the diff and the front axle," she wrote, "and when we felt it was solid enough, tried to get the old girl out. But she wouldn't budge."




Eventually towed out by a couple of truckers, they holed up for a day and waited for the country to dry out a little. Back on the road, they met up with fellow travellers heading north and travelled in a convoy, helping one another out when someone got stuck. Later, closer to Alice Springs, when the mud gave way to soft red sand, Dad would rev the side-valve-six hard in second gear, drifting the Dodge through the turns to keep up momentum. It took eight days to cover the 1,020 miles from Adelaide to Alice Springs. And this was on the main road—indeed, the only road—directly connecting the country's north and south coasts.

The stretch of the Stuart Highway that in 1955 had so challenged that tough old Dodge remained a rough go for decades after. On a 1973 family holiday, our Series II Land Rover struggled for two days to traverse a mere 77 miles. The main road was finally fully sealed in 1987.
