

on Sunday 15th October 2023. between 11am and 3pm.


If you have a "club" vehicle (historic or race), feel free to bring it so it can be on show as part of the celebration.





Dear All British Day Entrants,

It is pleasing to report our new committee is on track to stage and celebrate the 40th All British Day next March. Each year I am aware that, many years ago, many may have attended a much smaller display of cars at St Clair Reserve Woodville in the early 1980s which was the start of All British Day. A day put on by the clubs for the clubs.

The growth of the event necessitated a couple of changes of venues. After many years at Uraidla we had out grown the space available, and ten years ago we moved to Echunga. We have been fortunate to be able to display a wide range of British vehicles, made possible, thanks to the rich and diverse engineering and manufacturing might of Britain, complemented by the many enthusiastic and talented owners that keep these vehicles in fine fettle for the public to appreciate and admire each year.

All British Day has always been a family picnic day with vehicles displayed by marque or club. Many clubs use the day to bring awareness of their club and vehicles to the public. Some of the vehicles on display may not be all that well known to the public, but on the other hand, many vehicles on display earn recognition from passers-by, and it is not uncommon to hear "I had one of those"! And, of course, the day is a good chance to catch up with friends and fellow enthusiasts.

All British Day is a community event, and we all must take some satisfaction that All British Day offers great fundraising opportunities for many of the local community groups that provide food and refreshments on the day. We have also been able to support the local school and the CFS with donations each year. However, we have had our obstacles, the biggest being Covid. This had a devasting effect around the world and a negative impact on many organisations, including those in SA.

From a financial perspective, as a not-for-profit event, our objective each year is to generate just enough funds to permit us to put on the event in the following year. Since 2016 we have both weathered and absorbed many price rises from suppliers and service providers. A minimal increase in entry prices will be introduced for 2024.

In March next year, we will have much to celebrate! An impressive display will be provided by the MG Car Club, the inaugural International British Bike muster including many and varied motorbikes, and finally, the 90th birthday of the Sporting Car Club of South Australia, a club that has a rich history in the South Australian motoring community. For those attending Echunga next year, I have no doubt many fine examples of British engineering will be on display.

All this is in addition to the other many excellent examples of British engineering that attend each year. September 30, 2023, is the date when we will open the website for registrations. We are looking forward to hosting ABD 2024. See you there!





06 JETTY ROAD

1898

With the development of the jetty and kiosk, Jetty Road grew in popularity as a service street for the surrounding houses. The road, originally known as Beach Road, was renamed in 1898. Note the typical 1920s building styles, especially the shaped parapets of some of the older remaining shop fronts.


The most prominent at 67-69 was built in 1924 by Alfred McLeod, a greengrocer and hairdresser. Next door (to the west) was built by Harry Southcott in 1912 as Tea Rooms.

THE ESPLANADE HOTEL

1888 135 ESPLANADE

Built as a guest house and kiosk in the 1880s, the building was renovated and extended in 1924. It has had numerous names over the last century, including the Grosvenor Private Hotel, followed by the Willa-Willa and Residential Café before being licensed in 1955 as The Esplanade Hotel. A favourite drinking hole for locals.
