





One find we had was the business that redoes seatbelt webbing and they use original materials and colours.



BAY TO BIRDWOOD 1986

Well the "Big One" is over once again, and this time it was really <u>BIG!</u>: I never appreciated just how many cars were involved until we neared Glenelg. With cars converging on the Bay Road from all directions. Progress was so slow as we neared the starting point that we actually stopped engines and pushed our cars.

On arrival our party of eight cars were ushered to several different locations, which successfully messed up our plans for a "vintage" breakfast together. I didn't really miss the sausages etc. cooked on a kero stove, but from that point, we only caught up with two of our party all day.

Unice and a friend in "Grandma" and Peter and me in the "Meteo" managed to stay together, and had a very good run, cheered on by the hundreds of spectators from their vantage points in the sunshine, but an unscheduled "loo" stop caused us to be separated again at Birdwood. This time it was getting serious because all of our food and refreshments were in "Grandma's" trunk, and the consequent change of paddocks to remedy this situation was not at all popular with a couple of Army blokes doing the organising, but we eventually settled down, had lunch and looked around the cars, and I doubt if I will ever get another chance to see such a collection in one spot again.

In view of the numbers involved there were bound to be some delays and the suggestion sheets supplied should make interesting reading, but in general I think the organising was good.

The only real annoyance we encountered came not from Rally entrants, but some outsiders in cars and dune buggies, taking advantage of the gap I usually leave to allow for emergency stops with the "Meteor's" not remarkable braking. - (I'm certain the last inch of travel on the brake pedal is somehow connected to the acceleration), and their darting into the gap caused a few anxious moments. Perhaps another brake pedal on Peters side might help because he was certainly going through the actions - not to mention the floorboards.

A great days motoring in perfect conditions, and I wonder what 1988's Rally will be like.
