Bridgestone World Solar Challenge: Darwin to Adelaide 12-19 October 2019

The A7CSA has been involved with this event since 2005, supplying control stop officials and with myself as Chief Timekeeper and A7J has reported on each in detail. Technology has overtaken my role, as GPS units are now used for recording the cars' positions on the road from Darwin; so for historical records, this is a brief account of this year's event.

This year 44 cars entered from 21 countries, including - Australia 7, USA 4, Japan 4, Sweden 4, United Kingdom 3, Netherlands 3, Germany 2 and Canada 2.

There were the same 3 classes as previously: **Challenger** – the *speedsters*; **Cruiser** – with *passengers* and **Adventure** – built to older specifications.

As usual, *Qualifying* was at the Hidden Valley race track, with a timed one-lap run to set the starting order.

RESULTS

CHALLENGER: #6 Green Lightning Top Dutch Solar Racing (NLD) was fastest at 1-51.9993 (this was 11 seconds quicker than the 2017 record), then #70 Covestro Sonnenwagen Team Sonnenwagen Aachen (DEU) at 1-59.2089 and #88 KUTE EAGLE Kogakuin University (JPN) at 2-01.8700.

CRUISER: #98 Priscilla ATN Solar Car Team (AUS) at 2-13.4020; then #75 Violet Sunswift (AUS) at 2-19.9483 and #25 Sophie 6 IVE Engineering Solar Car Team (HK) at 2-21.9747.

ADVENTURE: The only car entered failed to record a time.

The Sunday morning start was in front of Parliament House in Darwin's State Square and all cars had to travel 3022 km to the finish in Adelaide's Victoria Square. They had 9 compulsory stops at Katherine, Daly Waters, Tennant Creek, Barrow Creek, Alice Springs and Kulgera in the NT, then Coober Pedy, Glendambo and Port Augusta in SA before the timing finish at the Torrens Parade Ground, from where they were escorted to the ceremonial finish in Victoria Square.

CHALLENGER Results

- **Day 1:** Sunday **Daly Waters.** #21 RED E Solar Team Twente (NED) had a 25 minute lead over #6 Green Lightning, which was only 2 minutes in front of #3 Nuna Vattenfall Solar Team (NED) showing at this stage the Dutch were still the teams to beat!
- **Day 2:** Monday **Barrow Creek.** #21 RED E still led with a 20 minute break to #3 Nuna, which was only 5 minutes in front of #8 BluePoint Agoria Solar team (BEL).
- **Day 3:** Tuesday **Kulgera.** #21 RED E still led with an 11 minute break to #3 Nuna, which was now 19 minutes in front of #8 BluePoint.
- **Day 4:** Wednesday **Port Augusta.** Around 20 minutes into the day's run, strong cross winds were blowing and a big gust caused #21 RED E to hit the side of the road, fall down the slope and roll. The driver was unharmed but the car was irreparable. #70 Covestro Sonnenwagen also was a victim of the winds, the severity of which then caused a speed limit of 80 kph to be imposed until conditions improved.

The new leader was #3 Nuna now leading by 7 minutes from #8 BluePoint, with #10 Tokai Challenger Tokai University Solar Car Team in third place, having only checked through Glendambo.

Day 5: Thursday – **Adelaide.** The dramas continued! #3 Nuna was still leading when, 263 km from the finish, it caught fire and quickly burnt to a smouldering heap; fortunately the driver escaped unharmed. (A dramatic photo of the burning car featured on the front page of *The Advertiser* on Friday!)

The first car to Adelaide was #8 BluePoint, arriving at 11.52 am: second was #10 Tokai Challenger at 12.04 pm with #2 Electrum University of Michigan Solar Car Team (USA) in third at 2.45 pm. The final results show 27 cars were classified, although 11 of these had been trailered to Adelaide.

CRUISER Results

These 13 cars competed in a regularity/efficiency event, with outright speed not the main factor but a formula was used - covering speed, energy efficiency and number of passengers carried, among other criteria - and points were applied to determine the leader.

The winner was #40 Stella Era Solar Team Eindhoven (NED) from #75 Violet Sunswift (AUS) and #25 Sophie 6 IVE Engineering Solar Car Team (HK) - the remaining cars were trailered to Adelaide.
