

Friday Oct 16.



Then on to Swan Reach, via Cadell. I must say that I found the stretch from Cadell to Swan Reach rather uninteresting, but it was a great day for a 94km run. We parked adjacent to the Murray River at the Swan Reach oval for a show 'n' shine, with a "running board lunch".

One of the cars entered was a beautiful 1929 Nash Sports (the maroon one in the pic). It was excellently restored and looked stunning – even more so when the bonnet was raised to reveal a thumping big straight-8 that could have powered the Queen Mary.

An interesting feature was that it had 2 spark plugs per cylinder fired from one distributor that had 8 sets of twin high tension leads to the spark plugs. What was additionally unique was that the distributor was on the right-hand side of the block and the H-T leads for the left bank of spark plugs ran through a channel cast into the block between number 4 & 5 cylinders. With only one coil and one distributor the dual spark plugs still represented only one ignition system. But what the hell – if you could afford to put fuel in the monstrous engine you could afford the tow in the event of an ignition failure.

There was an interesting museum as well as a car collection for us to view during the afternoon as well. Then back to Waikerie by the direct route – 66km

Sunday night was the presentation dinner at the Hotel where we had a good dinner and an enjoyable night.

help comrades who were suffering the mental problems so many veterans experience. There was a significant story about these very men in the Magazine section of the Advertiser on Saturday 14th

November. You might have seen the article. After leaving Morgan we drove on through Eudunda to Kapunda where we stopped for lunch at the One White Kite Café – strange name but very good food - to the point of excess. The café is run by two ladies who do all the cooking in a tiny kitchen on site. Great food, and if you are there I can recommend it.

From Kapunda we made our separate ways home after a great week-end away. The Riverland Club hosts its rallies every 2nd year, and a small contingent from our Club has been there for the last 4 rallies. As the club is spread throughout the Riverland, the event moves between Waikerie, Barmera, Loxton, Berri and Renmark. The rallies are simple in their format, the weather is usually typical sunny Riverland climate, and it's a great few days away with some very nice cars to look at and lovely Riverland scenery. 

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



Breakfast and trip to Warrawong Sanctuary 1st November 2020




If by the 1st March 2021, you have not

renewed your membership, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles will be advised as to your non-renewal, and in due course you will receive a notice from the Registrar of Motor Vehicles

advising that the Club Registration on your vehicle is cancelled. Full details of owner responsibilities regarding Club Registration appears on pages 13 & 14 of the Code of Practice for vehicles on Club Registration part of which is reproduced below:

Conditions of Use of Scheme Vehicles - Duties of Vehicle Owners

- 3.5 In accordance with the Regulations and this Code, the owners of vehicles must abide by the following conditions when operating Scheme registered vehicles. They must:
 - · maintain a financial membership of a recognised motor vehicle club at all times;
 - not drive their conditionally registered vehicle on a road or road related area more than 90 days in each period of 12 months registration;
 - not drive their conditionally registered vehicle on a road or road related area unless they have completed the nominated journey in the log book (the log book must be in the format approved by the Registrar for the Scheme) prior to commencement of the journey;
 - carry the conditionally registered vehicle's log book in the vehicle while driving on a road or road
 related area and produce the log book for inspection on request made by a police officer or
 authorised officer under the Act;
 - not drive, or allow anyone else to drive, the conditionally registered vehicle on the road for fee, hire or reward;
 - not drive the conditionally registered vehicle on a road or road related area if it does not comply with this Code;
 - · not have more than one current log book for any vehicle;
 - while driving on the road or road related area, carry the appropriate vehicle exemption documentation that permits the registration and use of a historic (where applicable), left hand drive or street rod vehicle on roadways;
 - · present their vehicle/s for an inspection upon the request of the club or the Registrar;
 - cancel the conditional registration of the vehicle when a change of ownership of a conditionally registered vehicle occurs or when they are no longer a financial member of a club. The log book issued for the vehicles must be returned to the issuing club for cancellation.
