Road Testing Our Restored Austin 7

Our 1935 Austin 7 was mostly restored during the time of COVID, although restoration did begin sometime prior in about 1972. It was registered on 6 June 2022 with 18 miles on the restored odometer. We've named her the "Eagle" because she came with an eagle on the radiator cap.

For the Eagles' first road test we decided to join Andrews' drive to Birdsville. Our crew included Trevor & Rosalie & friend Chris. The 2 boys had both driven the Austin in the early days prior to restoration. We also brought along 2 moderns, a camper trailer & an enclosed retrieval trailer for support.

Our journey through the mid north was fantastic. Andrew chose some wonderful roads with long slow rise hills to drive up which was perfect to begin the bedding in process of a new motor. Gawler, Burra, Jamestown, Hawker, Farina, Maree. An oil leak was quite evident & found to be a cracked fibre washer & o-ring under a bolt. This was repaired in the evening at Hawker Caravan Park and thoroughly checked again at Maree. No further oil seepages were found.

At Maree we chose to take the Oodnadatta Track. This is where the bitumen ended & the dirt road began. We found a lot of the road had been freshly graded after recent wet weather & the grader crews we came across were delighted to see the Eagle zooming over their smooth roads at 50-60km/hr. In between the smooth sections we found stints of hard corrugations, dried deep wheel ruts, one creek crossing, bull dust holes and one wet bog hole. All were suitable for 2-wheel drive vehicles including the Eagle, but at reduced speeds. In most parts we slowed to about 40km/hr and even down to 10km/hr a few times.

We stopped for lunch at Lake Eyre South, had a camp fire at at William Creek Camp Ground, did a short spot of birdwatching for real eagles with tourist, Arthur, & picnicked under the Algebuckina Railway Bridge at the Neales River. After discovering the adjoining waterhole is permanent with a great camp spot alongside, we joined other nomads from Mundulla, Tassie & WA who had already set up for the night.

On arrival at the Pink Roadhouse, it felt like the whole town of Oodnadatta came out to meet us. There were many photos taken & questions to answer. The Painted Desert Road took us through the spectacular Arkaringa Hills to Arkaringa Homestead and Campground. Part of the road even took us along the bottom of the Arkaringa Creek creekbed. That night we discovered other travelers had been following us over the airwaves & were delighted to see the Eagle.

Homeward bound we headed for Mount Barry Station and at Coober Pedy the Eagle was loaded into the retrieval trailer for travel down the highway and back home.





Congratulations to *Gutter Rat Racing* in 17th and *Austin 7 Club SA* in 18th and thanks to Sue Gasson/Katrina Nitschke for this report.

"What a great weekend 30 & 31 July 2022 at Phillip Island – both SA teams being Austin 7/TTM Club members finished in the top half of the field 17th & 18th respectively out of 36 teams and the 2 SA teams provided 3 of the 5 women drivers (and the fastest 3 women) out of about 160 drivers.

Although notorious for inhospitable weather in winter, Phillip Island turned it on for the competitors. It was sunny with blue skies on the Saturday making the track picture perfect and on Sunday it was overcast, cool and dry – perfect driving conditions.
