

The following is a response to a question from the floor at a recent Federation meeting regarding the death of a member of a recognised club and the subsequent validity of the club registration.

DIT response:

In the event a person passing away, any vehicle registered in their name will remain as registered until:

- The registration expires; or
- The vehicle is transferred or re-registered in another name.

The registration of the vehicle is not automatically cancelled when a person passes away.

In the case of a vehicle that is registered as a historic vehicle, similar principles apply although historic registration is not transferrable.

Ultimately whether the vehicle is deemed to be registered will depend on the relevant club's constitution on allowed membership, and whether financial membership ceases immediately upon the death of a member. Individuals should be advised to check with their respective club on their membership rules.

It should be noted that vehicles being used under the Conditional Registration Scheme for historic, left hand drive and street rod vehicles must comply with the requirements of the Code of Practice. Conditions include that it is not driven for hire, fare or reward, is not driven on more than 90 days in each period of 12 months registration, and all journeys are entered into the vehicle's logbook. This includes where a vehicle is being used for a funeral procession, or for other purposes such as test driving.

The Department is aware that due to the nature of finalising deceased estates, in some cases, it may be months or years until these are settled.

A similar response came from Shannons. Insurance:

The response is similar to the vehicle's registration. The comprehensive insurance policy is still valid, so long as it remains financial (paid up), or the vehicle is transferred into another name. However, an authorised person, according to the deceased owners Will, or a lawyer, should make contact with the insurance company as soon as possible after the owner's death, so the policy details can be updated.



Advance Notice Border Run 2023

Friday 15th September to Monday 18th September Bulletin No. 1

This year's Border Run for the Austin 7 Club of SA Inc and the Austin 7 Club Inc (Victoria) will be centred at Mount Gambier SA.

This first Bulletin will provide an outline of the programme, more complete information (including pricing and booking instructions) will be provided in subsequent Bulletins.

While previous Border Run activities have effectively commenced on the Saturday afternoon upon arrival at the selected base town/city, most of the SA club members have historically travelled part way on the Friday, while those who were still on somebody else's payroll travelled the full distance on Saturday.

This year the SA first contingent will travel to **Naracoorte** on Friday 15th September. The option remains for others to travel direct to Mount Gambier on Saturday.

Any Victorians who would like to travel to join us at Naracoorte are most welcome to do so.

As the convoy leaves Naracoorte en-route to Mt Gambier we will have a guided tour of the famous **Naracoorte Caves**, followed by lunch at Penola. As we pass through Nangwarry (32km north of Mt Gambier, or 130km west of Hamilton (via Coleraine and Casterton) we will stop to have a look at the **Nangwarry Forestry & Logging Museum**. The Victorian members can rendezvous with the SA group at Nangwarry at about 2:00pm they wish.

Two nights' Accommodation and Saturday night's dinner in Mt Gambier will be at the **Presidential Accommodation & Suites** which has been renovated since we were there about 6 years ago. Sunday night's dinner will be at the Western Tavern (3 minutes walk from the Presidential)

Sunday's run will be to Port Macdonnell, with the main feature being a visit to **Feast's Classic Car Collection and Memorabilia**, lunch, and an optional visit to **Collectormaniac Antique Store**. It won't be a big driving day – approx. 80km round trip.

Additional details will be provided in Bulletin #2 in a few weeks. No action is required from you yet.

We are looking forward to good numbers from each side of the Border, and a bit warmer weather than our previous June events.


